well, there are no nicer people anywhere in the world than in North Carolina and especially the people belonging to the North Carolina Association of Municipal Clerks!

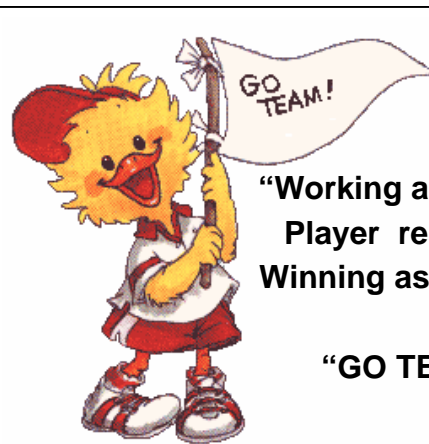
As I have said before it takes over one-hundred members to keep our Association operating to the highest standard of which we are accustomed. When I began setting up my committees last year, not

# Waldensian Festival marks 32 years in Valdese, NC

This year marks the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Waldensian Festival in the Town of Valdese. Our town is rich in history and we invite you to join us in the "Celebration of the Glorious Return."

The Waldensian festival is held each year on the second Saturday of August on the Main Street of Valdese to celebrate what is known as the "Glorious Return" of the Waldenses back to their native valleys in the Cottian Alps of Northern Italy after being exiled to Switzerland. This celebration is mirrored around the world by other Waldensian communities. The festival will begin on Friday, August 10th with a "cruise in" of approximately 150 old cars on Main Street. Also on Friday there will be live entertainment and children's rides.
