Some Things About the City of Fayetteville, NC — NCAMC District 7

Fayetteville is a city in Cumberland County, North Carolina, United States. It is the county seat of Cumberland County and is best known as the home of Fort Bragg, a major U.S. Army installation northwest of the city.

Fayetteville has received the All-America City Award from the National Civic League three times. As of the 2010 census it had a population of 200,564, with an estimated population of 204,408 in 2013. It is the sixth-largest municipality in North Carolina. Fayetteville is in the Sandhills in the western part of the Coastal Plain region, on the Cape Fear River.

The City Council consists of a Mayor and nine City Council Members. All nine members are elected from single member districts, and only citizens residing within each district may vote for each district seat, the Mayor is elected at large. All members of the Favetteville City Council serve concurrent two year terms (no term limits). The City

The City of Fayetteville employs 1,616 people, and has an annual operating budget of approximately \$225,843,701 (excludes funds managed by the Public Works Commission).

Council has oversight of 23 Boards and Commissions.

There are some multi-million dollar big ticket items the City Council are working on this year.

Parks Bond: Fayetteville voters last year passed a \$35 million bond issues and property tax hike for new parks and other recreational amenities. The first two Splash Pads projects are scheduled to open this summer.

Multi-Modal Transit Center: The city's \$12.6 million construction of a modern transfer station downtown will improve ridership and public transportation, it is scheduled to open in May of this year.


Baseball Stadium: Capped at \$33 million, the stadium in the downtown area will be largest public investment downtown in decades, ushering in minor league baseball by 2019. The city will be hiring a construction manager at risk later this month, who will be responsible for building the stadium on time and within budget.

The City plans to break ground this summer.

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The applicant shall maintain a grade average consistent with good standing in high school and with expectations of admission to a recognized institution (or, if already attending a recognized institution of higher education, with good standing at that institution.) The current Committee will decide their rating scale for the GPA.
- 2. Participation in extracurricular activities (school and community and church).
- 3. Good character. The current Committee will decide their rating scale.
- 4. The applicant must have been accepted for admission at the institution of choice for the academic year for which the scholarship application is submitted.
- 5. Submission of completed application to the North Carolina Association of Municipal Clerks, giving complete information as requested, and must be remitted or postmarked on or before April 15 of any year.
- 6. The scholarship is open to anyone pursuing a higher education and is not restricted to relatives of members of the North Carolina Association of Municipal Clerks.



Blueberry Spinach Salad



INGREDIENTS

FOR THE SALAD:

4 oz fresh baby spinach 1/2 cup chopped broccoli

1/2 a ripe avocado

1/4 cup blueberries

1/4 cup crumbled feta cheese

2-4 TBSP dried cranberries

2-4 TBSP roasted sunflower seeds

black pepper, to taste (optional)

INGREDIENTS

POPPYSEED RANCH DRESSING:

1/2 cup of plain greek yogurt or sour cream

1/4 cup of buttermilk

1/4 cup good quality mayonnaise

1 clove garlic

1/2 tsp lemon juice or white vinegar

1 tsp poppy seeds

1/2 tsp dried parsley

1/2 tsp dried dill

1/4 tsp onion powder

1/4 tsp paprika

1/8-1/4 tsp garlic powder, to taste

1/8 tsp sea salt

1/8 tsp black pepper

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Start with the dressing (skip if using premade)
- 2. Ranch dressing always tastes it's absolute best made ahead of time. Whisk and chill for a few hours before serving or make things simple by tossing it together the night before.
- 3. Peel 1 clove of garlic, then smash and mince it into a paste.
- 4. Season with salt.
- 5. Combine salted garlic paste with remaining dressing ingredients and whisk well.
- 6. Pop in the fridge to chill for a few hours for flavors to set.
- 7. Wash + dry spinach.
- 8. Combine with broccoli, blueberries, dried cranberries, avocado, feta cheese, and sunflower seeds.
- 9. Toss with dressing and serve.
- 10. Season with black pepper, to taste.







